

Tech Update from the ICT Department






The LHC Parent APP has even more features for parents to keep up to date with important events, updates and for critical college notifications and daily organisation.





Extra Curricular Sign-up 'How to' Guide


 Log into College App. On the home page, select the 'Extra Curricular Sign-up' button to view all available sign-up's. The red circle in the top right hand corner of the icon indicates how many activities are available for sign-up to your student/s.

You can remove your students registration for an activity at any time, by pressing the 'Remove Signup' button.





5. After selecting 'Submit to School' a pop up window will appear. Please select 'Submit Signup'. At this point your students registration will be logged with the College.

Parent Portal


The 'Parent Portal' is a repository for parents to access documents such as College policies and Quick links to related information organised in a user-friendly style.


To access the new 'Parent Portal' via the APP you can select the top navigation button as indicated below. Content is organised under 'Quick Links' or 'College Policies'.

Cyber Safety message

Cybersafety is an ongoing challenge for all of us. There have been some fantastic resources made available by the eSafety Commissioner which are always useful awareness tools for students. This year has been a focus on Be an eSafe kid: Back to school Be an eSafe kid: Back to school - Truth or trap? Investigating fakes online eSafety Commissioner

For parents and carers there are live webinars such as 'Understanding and using parental controls to help protect your child online' which can be found at <u>Webinars for parents and carers | eSafety Commissioner</u>.

Finally, a summary of the Cybersafety tips we offer students:

- **Recognise online threats.** Common examples include suspicious links within emails from phishing scams, as well as cyber bullying.
- Develop Digital Citizenship. Utilising AI responsibly by keeping in mind academic integrity, data privacy, potential human oversight and deepfakes.
- Protect your personal Info. Use strong, unique passwords and two-factor authentication, regularly
 update software, and be cautious sharing personal information
- Use Learning Resources. Engage with game-based learning tools like Minecraft Education's CyberSafe to boost digital literacy.
- Seek Expert Assistance. When in doubt, ask parents, teachers, or other trusted adults for advice on using AI responsibly and online safety.
