The Sisters of the Good Samaritan started the College in 1916. We believe in the importance of education and having a good balance in life between studies, prayer, and recreation.

We provide our students with the teaching and support they need to do their best. We teach students to become flexible thinkers and to continue learning throughout their lives. We teach the skills needed to face challenges and be successful in today's world of technology.

Our approximately 1200 students from Grade 5 to Grade 12 receive a world-class education at our beautiful campus on the Brisbane River, near the centre of Brisbane. In addition to a high-quality academic program, students have access to a wide range of sporting, cultural, and service activities to develop leadership and interpersonal skills.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION COURSES

Lourdes Hill College warmly welcomes students from around the world to become part of our caring learning community, and to experience the difference an Australian education can make. Our hope is for our international students to have an enriching, safe and enjoyable school experience, from enrolment to graduation.

Our international students are an important part of our college community, connecting us to the wider world and helping develop our understanding and perspectives of the world. We look forward to welcoming your child into our community and helping her reach her academic potential.

International students may choose to enrol for a short period (a term to a year), or to graduate with the internationally recognised Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

SHORT-TERM STUDY

Experience life as a student in an Australian high school, develop your intercultural understanding, and improve your English and communication skills.

Entry: Grades 9 to 11

Duration: One term (8-10 weeks) to one year.

Availability of short-term study opportunities varies from year to year. Contact the Head of International Education to discuss your interest.

LONG-TERM STUDY

Complete secondary school in Australia and graduate with the internationally recognised Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). Eligible students will also receive an ATAR score which can be used to apply for entry to Australian universities.

Entry: Grades 5 to 11

Duration: Through to competition of Grade 12.

Entry into Grade 11 is only available for students transferring from another CRICOS provider, having completed at least one semester of Year 10, and is dependent on review of academic results and student interview.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION SUPPORT

We recognise the commitment and investment that families make when they choose to study at Lourdes Hill College as an international student. In addition to our high-quality academic programs, and dedicated professional teaching staff, we provide:

- A safe, supportive, and inclusive College that values cultural and linguistic diversity.
- A dedicated Head of International to support international students and their families with their application, arrival, and College orientation, and throughout their time at the College.
- Students have access to 24-hour support from both homestay providers and College international education staff.
- Targeted academic support and assistance for International Students.
- Personalised advice and support to choose a pathway to post-school study in Australia from our experienced Careers Counsellor.

INTERNATIONAL ORIENTATION

Upon arrival to the College, students are provided with an orientation which includes:

- Tour of the College to introduce the facilities and locate classrooms on the student's timetable.
- Explanation of College behaviour expectations, policies, and procedures.
- Uniform fitting by our experienced uniform shop staff.
- Technology induction to set up their student laptops, network account, and access College systems.
- An opportunity to find out about co-curricular activities and ask any questions they may have about the College.

Students are also introduced to buddy students to assist in their transition to College life.



ACADEMIC PROGRAM

JUNIOR SCHOOL

Students in Years 5 & 6 study the Australian Curriculum and Religious Education, as well as specialised LHC programs including our Stella Wellbeing Program. Junior School students will also study specialist subjects including Music, Drama, Japanese, Visual Art, HPE and Technology will be taught by specialist teachers in our state-of-the-art Music, Drama and Art classrooms.

The Junior School classrooms are located in a dedicated area of the College and are flexible learning spaces designed to prioritize high-quality educational outcomes, and cater to diverse learning behaviours and needs, offering access to various indoor and outdoor environments.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students in Years 7 to 9 study a core program with a rotation through a selection of elective subjects, providing a range of academic experiences to develop critical thinking, creativity, and help them to make informed decisions about their future schooling and career pathways.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION & TRAINING (VET)

Senior students have the option to undertake nationally recognised certificate and diploma courses as part of their course of study. Lourdes Hill College offers VET courses in business and health services through a range of Registered Training Organisations (RTOs). These courses can be used these to contribute towards their achievement of a QCE, develop practical skills and knowledge, and can provide alternative pathways into post-secondary education.





SENIOR ACADEMIC RESULTS

Eligible senior students receive an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) score between 0 and 99.95 which can be used to apply for entry to Australian universities.

Of students graduating Year 12 in 2023:

- 5 received an ATAR above 99.00
- 36% received an ATAR above 90
- 54% received an ATAR above 85
- 82% received results of an A or B in General Syllabus subjects

PASTORAL CARE

Pastoral care is an important aspect of student life Lourdes Hill College. Our caring and experienced House Pastoral Leaders, Home Group Teachers, and College Counsellors are all available to support student's social and emotional wellbeing.

- Students are placed into one of eight College Houses, each named after an important woman in the College's history.
- From Year 7, students are placed into a Home Group with other students from Year 7 to Year 12 and a Home Group teacher who oversees their pastoral care and welfare.
- Year 7 students are paired with a Year 11 'Big Sister' to help them adjust to life in secondary school.
- All students take part in the College's Stella Wellbeing Program, developing personal skills in Relationships, Emotional Intelligence, Growth Mindret, Interpersonal Skills, Mindful



Emotional Intelligence, Growth Mindset, Interpersonal Skills, Mindfulness, and Leadership.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

The College features specialist classrooms including:

- laboratories for science and technology subjects
- rehearsal rooms and spaces for music, dance, and drama
- studio spaces and a photography dark room for visual art and design subjects
- kitchens and workspaces for food and nutrition, hospitality, and textiles subjects

Our campus sits on the Brisbane River and features:

- Tuguluwa: College water sports facility for rowing, sailing, and kayaking that includes a full training and conditioning gym
- The Good Samaritan Centre: Indoor multi-purpose sports hall for aerobics, netball, basketball, volleyball, and many other activities
- The Stella Centre: Covered sports centre with two multi-courts for netball, basketball, tennis, and volleyball
- 25-metre outdoor pool

Lourdes Hill College has a partnership with the nearby Morningside Panthers Australian Football Club to use their playing fields for sports lessons and Co-curricular sports, and includes access to changing and classroom facilities.

The AEAS Examination is preferred, particularly for Years 5 to 9. School-assessed written pieces of work in English may also be requested as part of application. Please note that the scores above are a guide. Student interview determines the success of application. All applications are assessed on an individual basis.

Depending on their English results, students may also be required to complete a Primary School Preparation (PSP) course, Secondary School Preparation (SSP) course, or ELICOS program before commencing mainstream studies at the College. In this case, the College has relationships with several leading English schools and can arrange introductions.

ENROLMENT APPLICATION PROCESS

To enrol as an International Student at Lourdes Hill College, access the International Enrolment application documents on our website <u>www.lhc.qld.edu.au</u>. You can also find a listed of registered agents for International Education if you prefer to use an agent to manage your application.

Along with the International Education Application Form completed by the student and their parent(s)/legal guardian(s), please also submit:

- Copies of Student Academic Reports from the previous two years of study, including a copy of the most recent results. If reports do not include details of student behaviour, course engagement, and attendance, an additional statement from the student's current school addressing these is also required.
- Proof of identify and age (i.e. birth certificate)
- Photocopy or scanned copy of passport page with name, photo identification, passport number and expiry date
- The non-refundable International Enrolment Application Fee of AUD\$250 (to be applied as a credit against first semester of non-tuition fees upon acceptance of enrolment).
- Written evidence of proficiency in English as a second language (i.e. English test results as per English Language Entry Requirements).


The College may also ask for additional evidence of written proficiency in English as a second language such as assessed written pieces of schoolwork in English.

All documentation must be in English or include a certified English translation.

* It is very important that full details of any medical or psychological condition that requires medication or medical supervision, and any learning difficulties or special needs a student may have are indicated on the application form. Failure to disclose this information at time of enrolment may be grounds for future cancellation of enrolment.

After your application is reviewed:

- 1. The student will be invited to an interview (if face-to-face is not possible, this will be arranged online)
- The College will notify the student if they can be accepted for direct entry or will be required to complete an ELICOS
 or English preparation course before beginning mainstream studies. If these are required, evidence of enrolment
 must be provided to the College.
- 3. Once an application is accepted, the College issues a provisional Offer of Enrolment and Written Agreement outlining total estimated fees for the duration of enrolment, along with a homestay application form
- 4. Once the signed agreements have been returned and initial fees paid, the College will issue a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) letter and Confirmation of Accommodation and Welfare (CAAW) if required.
- 5. The student applies for a student visa and notifies the College when it has been granted.
- 6. If the student is undertaking an ELICOS course or a HSPP prior to commencing at Lourdes Hill College, then a welcome day will be organised so that the student is able to organise resources such as uniforms, and to discuss any subject selection queries.
- 7. Arrangements are made for student arrival and commencement, such as homestay transfer, collecting student laptop, network onboarding, etc.
- 8. Student commences at Lourdes Hill College and receives international orientation on arrival.
